[The Committee report] That altho' some particular Advantage might Accrue to the Trade of this Nation by Disposing of a Quantity of the Goods and Manufactures thereof in the manner proposed by the Memorialists; yet in regard the granting the protection or pass prayed for, may be liable to such Abuses as cannot be prevented or remedied in the present Scituation of Affairs with the Crown of Spain Their Lordships are therefore of Opinion that it is not Adviseable for Your Majesty to Comply therewith.
