Sept. 17.	1,762. Order of the Queen in Council. Report of Lords of Trade and Plantations. On the petition of James Smailes, we recommend that if John Hubbard shall not have given security to prosecute his appeal, the appeal shall be dismissed and execution levied against him. Ordered accordingly. Governor Richier to take notice and act upon the order. [<i>Col. Entry Bk., Vol. XVIII., pp. 295–296.</i>]
