	<b>244. I.</b> Petition of Ralph Lane to the King. I have been detained in prison, in Barbados, for over twenty months, and still continue there among felons and slaves by order of Lieutenant-Governor Stede, who refuses me appeal to your Majesty or copies of the records of the Court of Justice. I beg that I may be allowed to appeal, that my case may be laid before you, and that I may have liberty to collect evidence in this Island and to prosecute my case in person.
