	<b>832. I.</b> Petition of Richard Rawstone to the King in Council. I was Deputy Collector of the Eastern shore of Maryland and as such seized two vessels which had made no entry; but the ships were extorted from me and I was imprisoned and shamefully abused by means of Henry Darnall and Nicholas Seawell, two of the judges there. I beg that my case may be heard again by Governor Nicholson, and that I may have liberty to prosecute Darnall and Seawell. <i>Copy. 1 p. The whole endorsed,</i> Recd. 31 Jan. Read 12 Feb. 93–4.
