	1,238. I. Petition of Captain Charles Talbot, H.M.S. "Falcon," to the King. I seized the pink "Swallow" for illegal trading being a foreign built ship, but she was acquitted by the Admiralty in Jamaica as free within the tropics in virtue of a former condemnation of that Court. The judgment is shewn by the Commissioners of Customs to be illegal. I beg to be allowed to appeal to your Majesty in Council. <i>Copy</i> . 1 p. [<i>Col.
