The Rumble Leticon of Richard Thayre of Brantinge in New England Of Lands in Bruintry

Sheweth_

That yo' Get nith severall others of yo Ma. Subjects about forty years ago went over to New England & purchased a larg tract of land of wompatrick Joging a great Indian Sachem, as by Seeds and other writings fully appeare, which fand is now called Brantrye, where they Settled therngelung and familyes and enjoyed a quiet_ possession for many years, That Mough the Southerne Bounds of the Colony of the Massachuge the Bay in New-England extended but three Miles in a direct Southerne line from every part of Marly River, ap by their Marter doth appeare, yet under plence of an imaginary line they have enlarged their Southerne -Bounds and thereby taken the Towne of Brankrye with other Towney and the land thereinto belonging nito Heir Jurigdiction, and by an Order of Generall Court have disposed of a great part of you bett land to Cap Thomas Savage and lage Clapp now or lake Inhalitante of Boston, Stat yo Let hath for many years been. digturbed in his possession by the Said Savage & Plays upon petence of their Order of General Court, and being compelled to defend his title to the Said Sand in the Courts of Boston, you Let at the Tryally produced his mirolled Seeds from the said wompatuck Josias But they would not be allowed of tohererpon you Bett did m' open fourt at Boston appeale to yo Mass m' Courcill to the end be might oftene a faire -Injall for his said land, But that being also refuged you let about three yeary since came over hither to make his appeale my son to you Ma; but through the pergragion

Agents here, who promised yo'Let' if he would for beare putting in his Beticon and Oppeale, he should have all lustice and right done in New England and be restored to his land, yo' Est accordingly for bore his prosecution here, and returned against for New England where instead of restoreing him, They have lately granted Indyment and Execution against yo' Let lands and Clantation, and have thereby disposses the Rim and his luster and flamily of their Estates to their other nine, without yo' Ma Royall highice and favour be bouchesfed to him—

Now foragment ap the Said Forme of Brantrye and Severall adjacent Former and Landy Hereintobelonging are not miduded within the Technic of the
Charters or Grants either of New Languages or the
Massachusets Bay, but are midescendant from either
of their Jurigdiction, and jmediatly under yo that
Government and Authority, and that you bet and the
other Broprietors being loyall Subjects are degirous
of being ruled according to the Lang and Mathods of
you Man grations Government here both in thursh and
Itake and not to be Subject to the Tyranny & oppression
of the Said Colonys—
