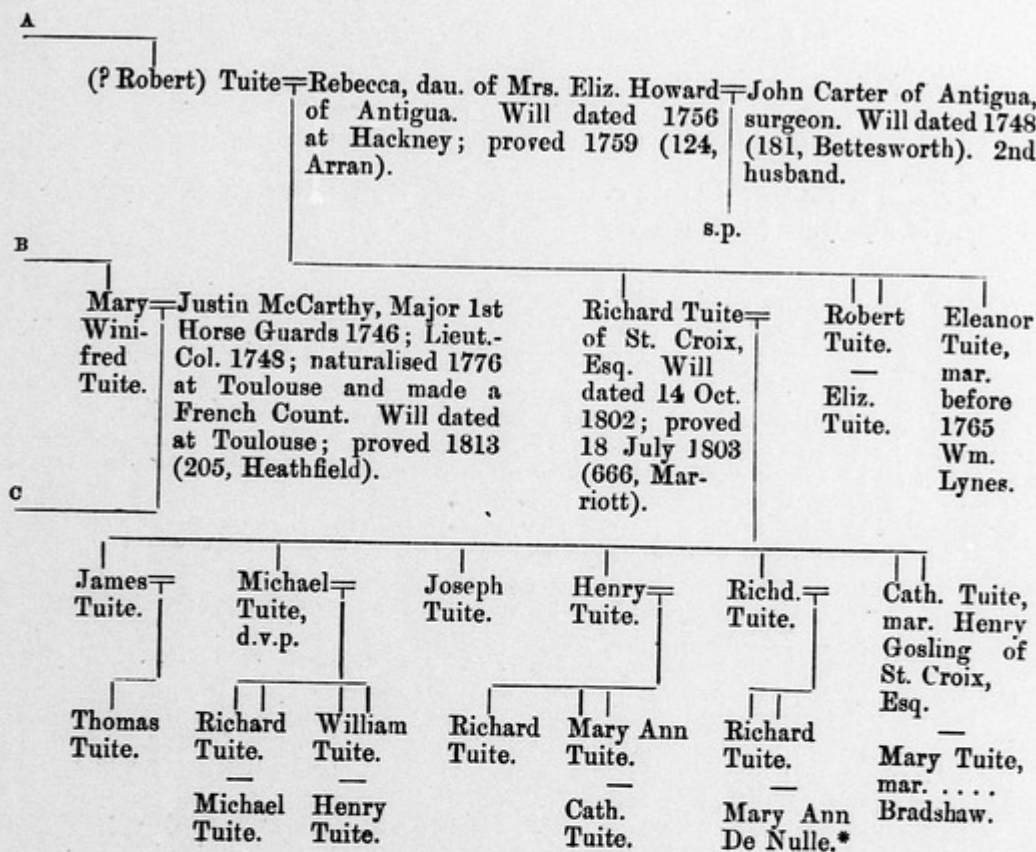


TUIE OF MONTSERRAT AND ST. CROIX.

Appeals to the Privy Council.

Add. MSS. 36,216—36,220, British Museum, contain printed statements of cases on appeal from the plantations to H.M. in Council. The cases were first heard before the Committee of the Privy Council, and many of them include voluminous legal notes written by Yorke the Attorney General. BARBADOS.

Isaac and Abraham Mendez, Appellants, against William Rees Battyn,† an Infant, by Edward Jordan his Guardian, Respondent.

John Battyn of Barbadoes by Ind're of 7 Jan. 1692 conveyed his plantation and slaves to three Trustees to raise £1500 apiece for his two daus. with remainder to his only son William and d. on 10 Jan. three days after.
